

Artist Statement: Ella Lynch

In my Visual Arts Designation, I have explored the importance of a bathroom with color and texture by taking film photos of my model, Annie Greenfield, in her attic bathroom. Bathrooms tend to be an inappropriate setting where photos are never taken. I decided to go against the stereotypical ideals and make this bathroom have no choice other than to utterly stand out by using extreme colors that contrast each other: aqua, orange, yellow, red, and black. Turning up the luminance of the colors achieved not only a more dramatic color pop, but added more texture. These photos were taken on a film camera and edited on lightroom. Taking photos of my model in her bathroom allowed her to be openly confident in front of the camera, which not only made her a better model, but ultimately proved that bathrooms are a place that people can be confidently themselves without judgement.
